**Iddiskuti.** X'inhi l-kulur tal-qoxra ta' Ben? X'tistgħu taraw fuq il-qoxra tiegħu?

**Iddiskuti.** Għaliex taħsbu li l-bebbuxu għandhu bżonn jibqa' mxarrab? X'taħsbu li se jgħri lil Ben fix-xemx?

**Fatt.** Il-bebbuxu jieħu n-nifs mill-ġilda, għalhekk għandu jibqa' mxarrab il-ħin kollu. L-ilma jippermetti lill-ossigenu jgħaddi minnu, imma mhux mill-ġilda.

Ben kompla jitmexx u x-xemx bdiet tishon. Beda jhossu għajjen ħafna.

Show a picture of a snail. Ask to describe what they see.

**Discuss.** What colour is Ben's shell? Can you see the spiral on his shell?

One sunny morning Ben went to explore the garden. He slid along the wet grass, leaving a shiny trail behind him to help him find his way back home. Ben was excited, but he didn't know that snails mustn't go out in the sun, or they will get dry. Snails must always stay wet.

**Discuss.** Why do you think snails need to stay wet? What do you think will happen to Ben in the sun?

**Fact.** A snail breathes through its skin, so its body must be wet at all times. Water allows oxygen to move through it, but not through skin.

Ben crawled farther and farther away from his home, and the sun grew hotter and hotter. Ben began to feel very tired.

"Oh no," said Ben, "I think I'm in trouble."

Just then, a kind girl called Sarah came skipping into the garden. Sarah loved helping others, and she loved helping animals most. She saw Ben's snail trail in the sun and she knew he was in trouble.

Have the children pretend to be Sarah, looking for snails that need help.

**Discuss.** What would you do if you saw a snail in the sun?"

"Look, Mummy!" Sarah said, "There's a snail trail in the sun! It must be a baby snail who doesn't know it must stay in the shade!"

Sarah's mum smiled and said, "Let's go help him, dear."

Mummy loved how her little girl was always kind to others in trouble. Sarah followed Ben's trail. Soon she found him, panting and looking sad.

"Oh, you've been in the sun too long!" Sarah said to Ben, "But don't worry, I'll save you!"

**Discuss.** How do you think Ben felt when Sarah found him?

Sarah picked Ben up carefully. She placed him gently in the shade of a big plant. Ben was happy in the cool shade.

"Thank you, Sarah," he said with a tiny snail smile. "Now I know that snails must never go out in the sun!"

**Fact.** Snails lose water from their bodies when they move and leave a shiny trail. This is why they come out at night or in the rain to stay moist.

Sarah giggled and said, "It's okay, Ben. We all make mistakes."

Ben and Sarah became good friends.

## Part 2

This could be done during circle time. Ask the children if they remember an occasion when they felt sad and cried; or who their friends are in class. Let the children take it in turns to share their experiences.

**Discuss.** How do you feel when you see a friend crying? What do you think Ben will do to help Sarah?

"What happened, dear Sarah?" Ben asked. "Why are you crying?"

"Because all the children can write the first letter of their name," Sarah sobbed, "But I can't do it. And now everyone is laughing at me!"

**Discuss.** Have you ever felt sad because you couldn't do something others could? How did it make you feel? What can we do when we see someone is upset?

"Don't worry, Sarah!" said Ben, "I can help you with that!"

Ben climbed on a leaf and he began to twist about. Now, as you know, when snails move about, they leave a shiny silver trail.

"Oh, how clever!" clapped Sarah, "You are writing the letter S!" Sarah watched as Ben went on another leaf. He made another letter S with his shiny silver trail.

**Suggestion.** Here you can model how to write the letter S with your finger or ask the children if they can make the letter S with their body

"You see, Sarah," Ben said. "It's easy. You can do it too! Just trace with your finger the mark I make, and you'll learn it."

**Fact.** A snail trail allows the snail to move smoothly and to find its way back home.

Sarah tried and tried, and with Ben's help she learned to write the letter S. Nobody at school teased her anymore because her letter S was the neatest one in class.

"How did you learn to write such a pretty letter S?" asked Teacher.

Sarah smiled. "My friend Ben showed me!" she said.

**Discuss.** How did Ben help Sarah? Why is it important to help our friends?

### Part 3 (Ben teaches Sarah about snails)

After helping Sarah with her letter, Ben wanted to tell her more about snails.

"Sarah, did you know that when the weather isn't right, snails go to sleep? When a snail goes to sleep, it makes a kind of lid across its shell opening, so it stays inside cosy and snug.

"Really?" said Sarah. "What happens if someone disturbs you?"

"If a sleeping snail is pulled off a wall or a branch, the lid breaks and we can dry up and die. So, it's very important not to disturb a sleeping snail."

Sarah nodded seriously. "I understand, Ben. I'll make sure to tell my friends."

Ben continued, "When we sleep, we should not be disturbed. We often sleep because the weather is too cold or too dry for us to be outside."
